Youth 2000 Summer Festival

Last weekend was Youth 2000's Summer Festival. You might remember the volunteers who spoke at our Masses a few weeks ago inviting young people to attend. What an incredible event it was! Over a thousand young people (including many from our Parish and from Mayo, generally) gathered in Clongowes Wood College from Thursday-Sunday.

It's the largest spiritual/religious gathering of young people in Ireland. One of the most impressive things about the event is that it's entirely organised and run by volunteers who are themselves in their 20's-30's. Dozens of them take off work for a week beforehand to set up the space and prepare the programme.

The event is a packed schedule with Mass celebrated each day, times of Adoration, workshops, keynote talks and lots and lots of time to get to know each other. Two things all the festival goers benefited from was a lot of time spent growing in friendship with the Lord and in friendship with each other.

A friend of mine said it best about similar gathering. Seeing all the young people, along with young couples and their children (there were young children *everywhere*!) and young religious sisters mingling among them along with brothers and priests, he said "here you can see and know there's a future." He meant a future for our Church and Faith. And he was right! We will certainly be much smaller, but we'll be there. And if this weekend can teach us anything, it's that the young, emerging Church will also be vibrant and self-confidently Catholic.
