Feelings and Faith

Anyone who's been living their faith for any length of time knows that sometimes it feels good to practice our faith and sometimes it doesn't. Exploring 'why' might be helpful to persevere in believing and living our faith, even when the good feelings aren't there. Emotions don't always accompany encounters with God, not because God isn't there, but because our emotions/passions have become unmoored from the other important spiritual centres within us- the will and intellect. There's a division within each of us. That's why we find some base things attractive- and they make us feel good in some way. It's also why some good things are difficult to enjoy immediately. Here's an example: running. Running is not enjoyable when you first try to get into the habit. In fact, when you're out of shape it's a real slog! But once you get into shape you have changed. You've grown in your capacity to run and it becomes more pleasing to you. But it is not always pleasing, even when you are fit. This is true for many other things - even if you develop an affinity for it you mightn't ALWAYS enjoy it. But you know it is good. Therefore a mature person engages their will and decides to run, even when they don't feel like it. For the mature person their actions are not determined by something as fickle as feelings. Their actions are determined by what they recognize as good (with their intellect) and then they make a choice (engaging their will).

None of this is to say that emotions are bad. Far from it! When lined up with what we know to be good they provide a great "motor" driving us onwards towards that good. They just shouldn't be the basis by which we make decisions or make evaluations on what is good/bad. To bring this into the realm of our Faith, we recognise that in spending time with Jesus Christ at Mass or in Adoration it is often challenging, particularly when we first try. But we choose it anyway (will) because we know who this is and that it is the greatest privilege we have and best use of our time to be in His presence.

"I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus. All of us, then, who are mature should take such a view of things. And if on some point you think differently, that too God will make clear to you. Only let us live up to what we have already attained." - Philippians 3: 14-16
