Seven Deadly Sins

Jesus says in the Gospel today that it is from within, from our heart that evil emerges. Anyone who's honest with themselves knows that's true of us all. We have certain inclinations that we have to fight against and overcome. These inner tendencies are described in many places and ways but one of the most common in the Catholic tradition is the Seven Deadly Sins. They're considered deadly because of how harmful they are to our souls, to our relationships and to our becoming who we want to be. People used to learn these-you might remember them from school! But here they are below listed from most serious/dangerous to least, along with the virtues we should practice to counter them.

First and most serious is pride: pride is putting yourself in God's place, #1 in your life, as the one solely responsible determining your own identity, meaning of your life, right/wrong. We might ask ourselves: who do we think about more than anyone else? Whose plans matter? Do I think about what God wants for me? His plans? The remedy to pride is humility and obedience to the ways God speaks to us.

The second Deadly Sin is envy. <u>Envy is sadness at the good of others or gladness at their misfortune</u>. It's the attitude of an unhealthy soul, focused only on itself and jealous of what others have. The antidote for envy is: practice gratitude for what you and others have, admire and praise others, don't begrudge them!

The third Deadly Sin is anger. Some anger is a natural emotional response. That's not what we're talking about here. The deadly sin of Anger is the irrational, unreasonable desire for vengeance, hurting those who hurt you. It divides families, ends friendships. The antidote: forgive and quickly! (scripture says before the sun sets, before bringing gift to the altar), also watch your tongue! Don't speak words that hurt or damage someone's reputation, speak only words that build up and edify.

The fourth Deadly Sin is sloth. <u>Sloth is a sorrow in regard to spiritual good. You can't muster the energy/interest in the spiritual</u>. Indifference and complacency. Plenty of this in the Church! Antidote: (re)discover your mission- you must become a saint if you want to get to heaven, suck it up and serve (spiritual/corporal works of mercy).

The fifth Deadly Sin is avarice. <u>Avarice is the unreasonable or immoderate desire for riches.</u> We are sometimes unaware that we are stewards for goods entrusted to you by God for a purpose beyond yourself-even if you've earned them by the sweat of your brow/creativity! The antidote: practice generosity, give freely.

The sixth Deadly Sin is gluttony. <u>Gluttony is the immoderate or unreasonable pleasure in food or drink</u>. When that desire for food/drink is undisciplined it comes to dominate us and we overindulge at the expense of the spirit. Think here of comfort eating, binge drinking, spending lots of money in restaurants or on takeaways, etc. The antidote is asceticism (discipline your lower nature), fast.

The seventh Deadly Sin is Lust. <u>Lust is the objectification of another human being for the satisfaction of your sexual desire</u>. Your sexual desire is not a bad thing! Lust is a MISUSE of what is a good God-given desire. Antidote: chastity (note: this is not not having sex, but working for a disciplined sexual desire, integrated with your profound respect for the other and yourself as a person).
