As we become more accustomed to the conditions which are necessary for the public celebration of Masses it is only right to express our gratitude to all those volunteers who have made it possible, and to thank all of you Mass goers who have cooperated with their instructions and guidance. The way in which the volunteers have so personally and professionally looked after you has been much commented on and appreciated. We will still need many more people to help as time goes by and we continue to appeal for more help. The possibility of listening on the car radio or on the loudspeaker and getting Holy Communion after Mass is all that can be offered when we are at full capacity.
