

Easter Day of the Lord's Resurrection

I like the story about an ageing flower-lady with an outdoor stall. Her clothes were old and shabby, her face weather-beaten and wrinkled. A regular customer asked how she was always in good form. 'It's my friend Jesus', she replied. 'Good Friday was the worst of days. Three days later, Easter Sunday, the best of days.
