## 11<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time *Matthew* 9:36-10:8

In the gospel today we hear that Jesus has deep compassion for the people, because they are like 'sheep without a shepherd'; with no real spiritual leadership or mentors to guide them they cannot grow in their faith or reach their full potential. The religious and political leaders who are mean to care for their well-being have instead oppressed and exploited them. So, when Jesus sends out the Twelve disciples he sends them first to 'the lost sheep of the house of Israel', to the people, yes, but also to the religious leaders of his day. Jesus was a radical reformer, who was concerned at this point not with setting up a new religion but with transforming his own faith community.

Where reform is concerned, there will always be obstacles. These obstacles usually come from within, because reform involves letting go of what no longer serves. The ego finds this difficult. Individually and institutionally, we are in need of conversion and transformation. Conversion enables us to be authentic to the inclusive, communal, and universal message of Jesus. It allows us to deepen and nourish a more authentic spirituality. Today many people are (re)discovering the wisdom traditions in Christianity, turning towards the mystics, returning to practices like *Lectio Divina*, embracing contemplation and silence, reconnecting with treasures we have forgotten (Mt 13) or perhaps were never taught. It is one of the signs that we live in a time of great change and that holding on to that which no longer serves will not help. The Twelve are sent out to heal and revive 'the house' and to let in some fresh air.
