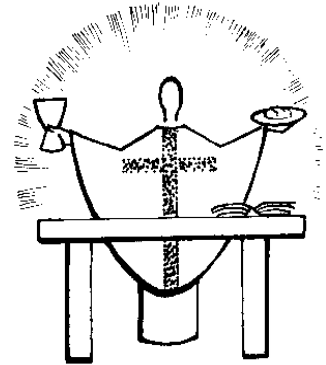

Church of the Holy Rosary – Masses

As we become accustomed to celebrating Mass together again – in very different circumstances – here in the Church of the Holy Rosary we need to thank all those who continue to make it possible, namely, our volunteers who work both outside and inside the church. People have been very complimentary on how well organised it is. As the numbers coming to Mass at weekends in particular are increasing, we have, unfortunately, had to turn people away. We remind them of the possibility of listening in the car to the Mass on 105.3FM and of receiving Holy Communion after Mass, but that is of no use to those who have walked to Mass. We are installing a loudspeaker on the car park side to facilitate those people.

If you are in the happy position of being able to get to Mass on a weekday or weekdays, I would appeal to you to consider those people and families who can only come on weekends, and leave the weekend Masses to them. This is especially necessary for 10am Mass on Saturday, 7pm on Saturday and 10.30am on Sunday which would need to be left to the families whose Anniversaries, Month's Mind and 1st Anniversary are celebrated at those times. We have had to turn away close family members for those Masses and it has been the cause of much disappointment.

Re-opening of Breaffy and Ballyheane Churches - Update

Progress has been made in relation to having the webcam in Breaffy Church and we hope to be able to say the same about Ballyheane before too long. We will then need volunteers to arrange for the safe attendance of those who will be able to attend. There are 36 individual places in Breaffy and 32 in Ballyheane. Households who can sit together can increase that to a maximum of 50 in each church.
