## Pentecost Sunday

## John 20:19-23

## Breath of life

In his final moments on the cross, before he took his last breath, Jesus entrusted his mother and his beloved disciple to each other, establishing a new family for those he loved and held close in life. Now, Jesus breathes his Spirit into this new community, a new creation. In spite of Mary Magdalene's testimony that she has 'seen the Lord', the disciples are afraid and hiding. Jesus comes to dispel their fear, his first word a message and manifestation of peace: Shalom. Several times, Jesus had promised his friends that he would send them the Holy Spirit to remind them of everything he taught (Jn 14:26) and to guide them to truth (Jn 16:13). This Spirit of Jesus present with them, in a new way, bringing them to new life.
We read that Jesus 'breathed on them'. This breath of life is the same lifeforce that sustains us at every moment, connecting us to everyone and everything - the plants that give off oxygen, the air breathed by all living beings in the past, present and future. This is the sacrament of life that God breathed into Adam and Ezekiel, breath that gives and sustains life. It is the breath that God breathes into each and every one of us. It is no wonder, then, that many spiritual practices invite us to focus on our breath to become more present, because it is in the present we find God and this lifegiving Spirit.
In the creation accounts, we read that a 'wind from God' (Gen 1:2) swept over the primordial chaos. The Hebrew word used for wind is 'ruach', also translated as Spirit, the creative aspect of God. The Spirit is God's continuing presence in our world today. She is not confined to time or place, but dwells in everyone and is present in every culture and age. She is a gentle comforter and a vibrant guide, 'inspiring the prophets of each century to speak the word of God as it emerges newly and freshly in every age'.
