Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Peace to this house!

In today's gospel, Jesus appoints seventy-two disciples to go ahead of him to the towns he intends to visit. He recommends a specific greeting for them to use when entering a home. 'Peace to this house!' The words set the tone for the visit, and we might compare it to the traditional Irish greeting. 'God bless all here!' Jesus explains that, if a person of peace lives in the house, 'your peace will go and rest on him', and the disciples will find a generous welcome in return. The peace that governs our home life extends to all, including strangers in need.

It is significant that peace is the first blessing that Jesus advises his followers to bring. As the Covid-19 pandemic gave rise to repeated lockdowns, one of the shocking statistics that emerged told of the increase in domestic violence. This particularly affected women who had no respite in their homes from abusive partners, and it gave rise to a surge in calls for help being reported by charities that support women and children.

Violence or abuse have no place in our homes or in our relationships. Jesus calls us to be people of peace in all our dealings with others. Peace does not mean constant harmony or the absence of disagreements. But how we treat our families and the people we live with should be governed by a peace that comes from a deep respect for the other and a willingness to listen, to understand and to help. The peace we nurture at home will extend to all we meet. In Jesus' vision, it goes hand in hand with hospitality.
