Third Sunday of Easter

They finished through the darkness but their nets were empty. 'That night they caught nothing.' The darkness, however, was not just about the night sky. The darkness was also in the disciples. In the same way, the empty net is not only descriptive of the disciples themselves. They are as empty as their nets. Who hasn't experienced that darkness and emptiness here? You know what that's like. You fish, you work, you do your best but you still come up empty. In those times we have come to the limits of our own self-sufficiency. We have nothing to show for our efforts and nothing left to give. We're empty.

That's when Jesus, still unrecognised by the disciples, shows himself and says, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' That's not so much a question as it is a statement. Within Jesus' words I hear the echo of Mary's voice at the wedding in Cana when she said to Jesus, 'They have no wine' (John 2:3). Empty nets. Empty jars. No wine, no fish, no life. That's when Jesus showed himself.

Nets and jars cannot be filled unless they are first emptied. In the same way we can never be filled with Jesus until we are first emptied of ourselves, until we come to recognise the limits of our own self-sufficiency. The emptiness is not the end of a failure but a beginning. The miracle begins when the wine runs out. Jesus shows up when the nets are empty.
