Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time Gospel: Luke 20:27-38 Children of the resurrection

Will I have a body in heaven? Will I look young or old? Will I recognise my family and friends? When we think about the afterlife, we can find ourselves preoccupied with questions like these. In today's gospel the Sadducees, who do not believe in the resurrection of the body, are setting a trap for Jesus with the clever technical question. They quote the Law of Moses, which prescribed that a man whose brother had died without children are obliged to marry his brother's widow. And then they pose a far-fetched scenario: whose wife will the woman be in heaven?

Jesus sidesteps the trap by making their question seem absurd. He affirms the reality of the life to come but, while we might think of heaven as an improved version of our earthly life. Jesus says the relationships and concerns of this life will be transformed in the next. Questions like the one posed by the Sadducees ignore the radical freshness of God's vision for us and for God's creation.

In this gospel, the talk of marrying reflects the customs of the time, when a woman could be 'given' in marriage and was considered the property of her husband. Such things are in the realm of 'worldly' concerns, as Jesus puts it, things that 'belong to this age'. He contrasts this with the coming age where the 'children of the resurrection' will belong to nobody but God. In this vision, divisions of class, status or gender no longer exist. While the Sadducees impose their limited worldview on to God – as we humans tend to do – Jesus encourages us to live as 'resurrection people' in the fullness of his mission to bring love, healing and liberation to all (Lk 4:18).
